

OPERATIONS AND PROGRAMS GRANT OVERVIEW

Purpose

To provide general operating support or program support for successful ongoing efforts.



OPERATIONS AND PROGRAMS GRANT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Step 1: Determine whether your organization/program is eligible

Step 2: Logon/login to our online grant

system

Step 3: Submit application by July 15

Decisions will be emailed by Sept 1



OPERATIONS AND PROGRAMS GRANT PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Who can apply? 501c3 Non-profit organizations, non-501c3 nonprofits/organizations that are considered "charitable" and did not receive a 2-year grant last year.

How much can I apply for? Your organization can apply for between \$5000 and \$20,000 per year for up to 2 years.





HOW ARE OPERATIONS AND PROGRAM GRANTS FUNDED?

The grant program is funded by various field of interest funds and follows the original purposes of each fund and the intent set up by its donors.




WHAT IS A FIELD OF INTEREST FUND?

- A fund that has been entrusted to QCCF to use to support a specific area of interest
- May be created by one donor or supported by many donors
- You will submit ONE application, and we will award the funds based on the original intent of the donor



FIELD OF INTEREST FUNDS







WHAT WILL I SEE ON THE FORM?

We ask for:

- Charitable Status
- Organization/Program Information
- Impact and Outcomes
- Budget and Finances



If you've already put together information for another grant and want to submit that instead of the items in orange, that is an option this year!



HOW WILL MY APPLICATION BE EVALUATED?

Eligibility Does your request align with the purpose of the program and is your organization charitable? Preference will be given to applications requesting general operating support and to applications supporting existing successful organizations or programs.

Community Need Organization/program meets an identified community need in at least one of the six fields of interest.

Effectiveness Organization/program demonstrates effectiveness in achieving its goals relative to the dollars used.

Impact of Grant The grant will contribute strongly to the organization/program's overall success.

Equity Organization/program advances racial and other forms of equity in the Quad Cities region through its actions and its leadership.

Impact of Organization Organization/program has a track record of success and a positive community impact.

GRANTWRITING TIPS

- Take advantage of what already exists.
- Use a second set of eyes!
- Make sure you answer all the questions being asked.
